- Update on the Winter Dance and PTO funds raised so far this year (Mrs. Lynch & Michelle Curtin)
 - Raised just under 20K (not all profit) dollars with fall fundraiser.
 - Spent money on PE equipment, playground equipment, music and art programs, supported curriculum programs (Reading Eggs), basketball jerseys, student scholarships for field trips, interpreters (\$1200/yr), 16-17 school year biggest expenses was curriculum, character cup & field day.
 - State of the Union PTO meeting: \$600 in charitable student giving.
 - Winter dance family event: 7-9 on the 26th. The event is free to families including food and refreshments. Raffle tickets (\$1 at the door, cheaper in advance) for the auction items at the winter dance, lots of donations already given (list was dispersed) with more coming in. More information will be sent home soon to families about the dance.
- School Happenings & Updates (Mrs. Lynch): Accreditation, proposed security entry access points, iReady programs for next year.
 - School is in the final phase of accreditation phase. Company will decide which schools to visit in April.
 - Security- two glass walls to the right and left of Mrs. Godwin will be added to the school this summer. The main front door will require Godwin to buzz people in (similar to Mason, GRMS, and Osceola).
 - iReady options (computer program, instructional materials and teacher toolbox (pdf version of textbook)).

- Admin will survey teachers to see what to purchase
- District Updates (Mr. Mignon)
 - He is now school board chairperson.
 - PSA and parking concerns, sent deputy out to assess situations (unsure if any developments have been made).
 - Parking comes out of capital outlay (half cent sales tax and impact fees).
 - Another middle school is needed, land is expensive. School board made the decision to enhance/enlarge Mill Creek and make it a K-8 (becomes Mill Creek Academy).
 - K-8's prove to be effective through research.
 - Vote on Mill Creek Academy project sometime in April, projected to commence construction next school year.
