# Notes from Principal Taylor

Dear Hartley Families,

I want to take a moment to thank all of you who take time from your busy days to check your children's backpacks, support their efforts with homework, read with them, volunteer in the classroom or on fieldtrips, keep up with their grades on the Home Access Center, read the bi-weekly school newsletter and attend conferences with your child's teachers. The support you provide for your children's efforts at school absolutely effects the quality of their educational experience and academic success. When your children understand the value you place on their education, their work ethic and behavior reflect that, so thank you for being involved.

We have recently posted the winter and spring testing schedule on our school website and Mrs. Lynch sent out an email last week asking for volunteers to sign up to help proctor DE and FSA end of year exams. We have to start early recruiting volunteers because we need a lot of help over a long period of time. If you're able to give even just a few hours during this time, please sign up to volunteer.

Finally, please make every effort to ensure your child is on time every day to school. As the year has progressed, we've seen a concerning hike in the number of students tardy to school. When a child arrives late, the teacher must stop all instruction to adjust his/her attendance records which disrupts the class and can be embarrassing for the late student. Even just a few minutes tardy on a regular basis adds up to significant loss of learning during those critical "fresh" morning hours of instruction, so thank you for helping your child to develop the important habit of punctuality.

Hartley Visitors: You must be an approved volunteer to come into school and do any of the fun things at Hartley. You can no longer sign-in as a visitor. You must be an approved volunteer or an approved vendor.

If you would like to visit your child at school during lunch, attend a field trip, and/or volunteer at school, please fill out the volunteer application on the following website:

Once your application has been cleared through the school district and the St. Johns County Sherriff's office, it will be valid for three years. You will not need to fill out another application in the future, just let us know you need to be renewed. Your volunteer status, once cleared, will allow you to sign in at all St. Johns County Schools.

<u>Please do not check your child out early from school, or call after 2:00 PM (1:00 PM Wednesday)</u> to change the way your child goes home (EXCEPT IN THE CASE OF AN EMERGENCY). Thank you very much for your cooperation.

### Parent Information for FSA testing for the third, fourth and fifth grades:

Dear Parents,

The purpose of this letter is to inform you that 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade students will take the FSA Writes test on Tuesday, February 28<sup>th</sup>. Third grade students will take a paper based English Language Arts FSA test on March 27<sup>th</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup>. Third, fourth and fifth graders will take a computer-based Florida Standards Assessments (FSA) on dates ranging from April 10 – May 2. Specific testing dates for the different classes are posted on our website. Your student will have an opportunity to participate in a practice test to become familiar with the computer-based testing platform, item types, and response formats he or she will see on the FSA assessments. If you or your student would like to review the computer-based practice test at home, the practice tests and answer keys are available at <a href="http://www.fsasssessments.org/students-and-families/practice-tests/">http://www.fsasssessments.org/students-and-families/practice-tests/</a>.

For information regarding test session lengths for all Spring 2017 FSA assessments, please visit the FSA Portal at <a href="https://www.fsassessments.org">www.fsassessments.org</a>, click on the **Students and Families** icon, then select **Spring 2017 Testing Times**.

Please review the following policies with your student before testing:

- **Electronic Devices**—Students are not permitted to have any electronic devices, including, but not limited to, cell phones, smartphones, and smartwatches, at any time during testing <u>or</u> during breaks (e.g., restroom), even if the devices are turned off or students do not use them. If your student is found with an electronic device, his or her test will be invalidated.
- Testing Rules Acknowledgment—All FSA tests include a Testing Rules Acknowledgment that reads: "I understand the testing rules that were just read to me. If I do not follow these rules, my test score may be invalidated." Prior to testing, test administrators read the rules to students, and students acknowledge that they understand the testing rules by signing below the statement on their planning sheets, worksheets, or work folders.
- Discussing Test Content after Testing—The last portion of the testing rules read to students before they sign below the Testing Rules Acknowledgment states: "Because the content in all statewide assessments is secure, you may not discuss or reveal details about the passages or items after the test. This includes any type of electronic communication, such as texting, emailing, or posting online, for example, on websites like Facebook, Twitter, or Instagram." Please make sure your student understands that "discussing" test content includes any kind of electronic communication, such as texting, emailing, or posting to blogs or social media websites. While students may not share information about secure test content after testing, this policy is not intended to prevent students from discussing their testing experiences with their parents/families.
- Working Independently—Students are responsible for doing their own work during the test and for protecting their answers from being seen by others. If students are caught cheating during testing, their tests will be invalidated. In addition, the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) employs Caveon Test Security to analyze student test results to detect unusually similar answer patterns. Student tests within a school that are found to have extremely similar answer patterns will be invalidated.
- Leaving Campus—If your student begins a test session and leaves campus before completing it (for lunch, an appointment or illness, etc.), he or she <u>will not</u> be allowed to return to that test session. If your student does not feel well on the day of testing, it may be best for him or her to wait and be tested on a make-up day. Please remember not to schedule appointments on testing days.
- **Testing Accommodations**—If your student has an Individual Education Plan (IEP), Section 504 plan, or English Language Learner (ELL) plan, please contact the school if you have any questions to discuss the testing accommodations that will be provided for your student.

### SUMMER MARINE SCIENCE PROGRAM

Parents,

Applications for the summer Marine Science Program will be passed out by science teachers at all schools during the week of February 13<sup>th</sup>. Applications will be due back to science teachers by February 28<sup>th</sup>. Applications can also be downloaded at any time from the website prior to April 15<sup>th</sup> <a href="http://www-grms.stjohns.k12.fl.us/">http://www-grms.stjohns.k12.fl.us/</a> and click on the Marine Science link. The link also will have a complete day by day curriculum for each grade level, parent information, and a video from last year's program.

This summer program is available to all students currently in grades five through seven and has been sponsored by the school district since 1982. Three eight-day sessions will be held at Gamble Rogers Middle School with bus transportation provided. The dates for the three sessions this summer will be May30th through June 8th, June 12th through June 22nd, and June 26th through July 7th. Small classes of 12-14 students are separated by grade level. All instructors in the program are St. Johns County School District teachers.

The Marine Science Program is a carefully designed experience for responsible students who are interested in learning about our local marine environments. Learning is "hands on" in the field with students kayaking, canoeing, boating, hiking, snorkeling, sailing, windsurfing, surfing, SUP, (stand up paddleboarding), etc. Specific grade level activities and curriculum are attached to the applications and are also available from the website.
