

## FLORIDA STANDARDS ASSESSMENTS (FSAs)

The annual Florida Standards Assessment for our students in 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> grades begin April 2 with a Writing assessment for 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> graders. Testing will continue for English/Language Arts (ELA) and Math over the coming month. See the calendar on page 4 for all the days of testing.

Hartley students are well prepared to be successful on these assessments. Please help your 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> graders by making sure they are well rested, well hydrated, and have a good breakfast on the mornings that they are testing. Assure them that they will do well and that they should take their time to "show what they know!"

We still need proctors for the FSA tests occurring in May. Proctors protect our teachers and students by acting as witnesses that all testing protocols were in place during the test. The proctor is merely an observer who sits and watches. A training is provided by our school counselor on the first morning the proctor arrives to assist. Proctoring is not difficult! ## SUMMER MARINE SCIENCE PROGRAM



Parents,

The Summer Marine Science Program has extended the application process, as **we still have some open sessions available!** Calling all current fifth through seventh graders who love to be outdoors!

Applications can still be downloaded at any time from the website prior to April 19<sup>th</sup> at <http://www-grms.stjohns.k12.fl.us/marinescience/> . The link also will have a complete day by day curriculum for each grade level, parent information, and a video from last year's program.

Return the completed pre application to your child's science teacher who will turn it into the program. Once accepted, a final application will be mailed home within two weeks. Upon payment deposit and final application returned a confirmation of session letter will be mailed.

**We currently ONLY have spots available in our third session, June 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, July 1, 2, 3.** This is a perfect session to finish just before the Independence Day holiday. Small classes of 12-14 students are separated by grade level. All instructors in the program are St. Johns County School District teachers.

The Marine Science Program is a carefully designed experience for responsible students who are interested in learning about our local marine environments. Learning is "hands on" in the field with students kayaking, canoeing, boating, hiking, snorkeling, sailing, windsurfing, surfing, SUP, (stand up paddleboarding), etc.
