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W.D. Hartley's PBIS Program

(Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports)

It has been an incredible start to the 2023-2024 school year learning the school expectations and how to SOAR! Students met in grade level assemblies with teachers, administration, and staff to review what SOAR looks like in each setting around the campus. They learned what the acronym SOAR stands for and how it applies to all areas of the school. S- Safe, O-Organized, A- Always KAHFOOTY (Keep All Hands, Feet, Or Objects To Yourself), R- Respect.

Class families have been earning eggs (compliments) throughout their day in all settings and working towards "filling their nest" with a certain amount of eggs to earn a reward that they voted on together. Starting in January, students will earn individual points for their positive behavior and demonstrating the 6 pillars of character. They will use those points to go to the SOAR Store and "purchase" items.

Students will help clean up the school campus and work towards making it a beautiful place to be!
